

FY 2028 Capital Improvement Plans – Summary of Agency Requests

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Pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-793, the state has 3 major building systems. Each system is required to submit a Capital Improvement plan with proposals for state spending on capital projects to the Governor by October 15 of each year. Individual agencies within the ADOA Building System submit their requests to ADOA in August of each year as detailed starting on page 2. Projects are numbered and listed in priority order according to the agency plan. For some agencies, building renewal projects below a specified dollar threshold are aggregated. For such agencies, the listed numbers reflect the project's priority order according to the agency's capital improvement plan rather than their placement in the request summary.
